



FOUNDATIONAL DOCTRINE – REPENTANCE FROM DEAD WORKS

Foundational doctrines – Heb 6:1-2

1. Repentance is biblical

- Preached in the Old Testament Is 22:12; Jer 3:12-14
- Preached by John the Baptist Mt 3:2
- Preached by Christ Mt 4:17
- Preached by the early Church Acts 2:38; 3:19; 17:30

2. Definition of repentance.

- The word repent comes from the Greek word "metanoein" which means "to change one mind".
- Repentance is a <u>firm decision a change of mind.</u>

3. The fruit of repentance.

- Repentance produces a change of attitude and conduct 2 Cor 7:11
- Repentance produces joy Ps51:12

4. Definition of dead works

• Its man's tendency to trust in his own efforts to bring about salvation

5. How could a believer practice dead works?

- Cold religion (Doing things out of habit and tradition) Rev 2:4-5; 2 Tim 3:5
- Doing things to receive man's recognition (Fasting, praying etc.) Lk 18:9-14; Mt 6:5-18
- Trusting in anything other than God and His Word. (We can trust in our bank balance, job etc.) – Rom 12:1-2

6. Summary

Repenting from dead works is: Repenting from the works of the old nature or from the works of man apart from those of God.
