

1. **Definition**

 To help us understand our relationship with our Groom (Jesus) we must understand the Jewish wedding as Jesus often uses it as an analogy of His wedding to us.

2. Jewish wedding

- Selection of the bride by the father. The father sends a trusted servant,
 "Agent of the Father," to search out the bride. Gen 24; 1 Pt 1:8
- The price is established and agreed upon by the father and the son. –
 1 Pt 1:18-19
- The bride and groom are betrothed (legally bound).
- The contract must be written. (Torah, Bible)
- The bride must give her consent. Ex 19:8; Ex 24:3; Rom 10:9
- Gifts must be given and a cup shared. Lk 22:17
- The bride must be cleansed in a Mikvah. Ez 16:8-14; Ex 19:14;
 Lk 3:16; Acts 1:5
- The bridegroom departs to prepare a house for the bride. Jhn 14:1-3
- The bride is consecrated (made holy, set aside, separated from the world). The groom's father gives permission for the son to go to the bride. – Mk 13:32; 2 Pet 3:10
- The shofar is blown. The bridegroom returns with a shout, "Behold, the bridegroom comes!" and "Blessed is he who comes!" - Mat 25:6; 23:39; 1 Cor 15:52
- The bridegroom abducts the bride for seven days. Joel 2:16
- The marriage supper for all. The guests are invited by the father of the bride. A friend of the bridegroom relays the news. Jhn 3:29
